



POP free substances Declaration

Persistent organic pollutants (POPs) are organic substances that persist in the environment, accumulate in living organisms and pose a risk to human health and the environment. POPs are regulated worldwide by the Stockholm Convention and adopted by the Plenipotentiary Conference (Stockholm, 22 May 2001). It entered into force on May 17, 2004.

Implemented in the European Union by the "Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs)" Regulation published on June 20, 2019 (EU/2019/1021). The regulation limits the use of persistent organic pollutants in chemicals and articles.
